

Brutalist web design styles vary in aesthetic, ranging from minimalist to maximalist. Some are a mixture of both extremes, employing distinct avant garde themes. Let's take a look at some common substyles of brutalist designs.









lesson 01 Winimalism

LESS IS MORE.

With minimalism, less is more. Colors, text styles, effects, animations, textures, and other distracting elements are used sparingly. The overall UI/UX is over-simplified, with an emphasis on essential elements.

The objective of minimalist web design is to *under*whelm the user by optimizing their experience on your website or application. Minimalist designs are characterized by simplicity, elegance in aesthetics, and a sense of calmness, unity, and clarity. A sense of professionalism and sophistication evokes a sense of trust in the user.

The Rule of 7±2.

One important design rule to consider in minimalism is the Rule of 7±2. This rule purports that the human memory has a capacity range that can process between 5 and 9 objects (or concepts) simultaneously. This rule should absolutely be adhered to within a minimalist design. This means that no more than 9 concepts, or objects, should be present. The fewer concepts that are introduced to a user, the better.

























lesson 02 Maximalism

MORE IS MORE.

With maximalism, more is more! Unlike it's minimal counterpart, the maximalist design style is dedicated to distinctive, vibrant,

and unconventional artistic expressiveness.

Characterized by complexity, diversity, and extravagence, maximalist designs strive to leave a bold first impression. They are intentional in the evocation of the senses of excitement, creativity, and uniqueness.

Advantages of maximalist designs include increased engagement, visual stimulation, and experimentation in variation. Disadvantages are that designs can be too overwhelming, chaotic, and may not always adapt well to evolving trends. Users may become confused.

The Rule of ∞±∞.

There are no limits in maximalist design. The "Rule of Infinity Plus or Minus Infinity" purports that creativity shall be limitless in any direction of design objective. Normalcy, standards, or design conventions do not always need to be adhered to.





lesson 04 Neobrutalism

SOLID IS MORE.

Neo-brutalist designs are rooted in the solid philosophy that this design style should prioritize function, simplicity, and purpose. The objective is to depart from a conventional polished design, and focus on a functional, raw user experience.

Design aesthetics are stark and unapologetically direct and distinct, stripped down and focused on essential elements. Any animations are minimal, and elements are flat, bold, and solid.

Creative content clarity can compromise on the flexibility of fonts, which are often bold and geometric. Readability can be rigid and rugged, and layouts are often limited.

- Geometric shapes
- Strong color contrasts
- Distinct borders & edges
- Simple interface
- Flat elements
- Hard shadows
- Minimal animations
- Asymmetrical grids
- Clear & crisp content


The Rule of _±#.

















lesson 05 REFO FUTURISM

THE FUTURE IS MORE.

Retro futurism is the future as envisioned by the past. This themed substyle of brutalism utilizes a retro technology aesthetic characterized by futuristic graphics, cyber-themed typography, and vivid neon colors and smooth geometric shapes.

The entertainment, art, technology, and various other pop culture industries utilize this style. Intended to provoke a feeling of nostalgia, retro futurism evokes a diverse and varied mixture of raw emotions within the user.



RETRO FUTURISM THEMES.

Retro futurist designs can be broken down into two specific themes:

- Sci-fi
- Vaporwave

Sci-fi (science fiction) themes may have a focus on dystopian machinery and raw technology, with a retro or vintage tone.

Vaporwave themes have a focus on retro technology with a vivid and electrically charged exotic tone.





CHAOS IS MORE.

Anti-design is a form of maximalism that completely disregards any and all conventional rules of design principles and standards. A true form of brutalism, anti-design is truly raw, unapologetic, and extremely expressive.

DECONSTRUCTIVE DISPOSITION.

Anti-design attitude is one of disrespect for the expected aesthetics of standard web designs.



Analyzing the intention and purpose of an anti-design, elements are deconstructed by breaking them down as fragmented units, and displaying them in disharmony and disunity. Creative chaos of clashing and colliding elements, confusing collages, and complex animations are intentional and bona fide in their wild incorporation.

The Rule of *±∞.


